## WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 14, 2022 PARTNERSHIP ON WASTE AND ENERGY BOARD

A meeting of the Partnership on Waste and Energy Board (PWE) was held at 2:30 p.m. on Wednesday, December 14, 2022. Commissioners and staff participants met at the Ramsey County Environmental Health Office, 2785 White Bear Avenue North, Maplewood, Minnesota. Other participants and the public joined remotely.

#### **CALL TO ORDER AND COMMISSIONER ROLL CALL**

Chair Miron called the meeting to order at 2:30 p.m. Introductions of attendees in Maplewood were made.

#### **BUSINESS**

### **Legislative Platform**

Sam Richie, Fryberger Law Firm, presented an overview of legislative status going into the 2023 session.

- The budget surplus is partly due to supplemental agreements from 2022 that were not enacted.
- The Governor's budget will be released on January 24.
- There is discussion of a bonding bill, as it did not get done during the 2022 bonding year.
- Likely to be passed is a paid family leave program, adult-use cannabis and increased state spending on public housing, education, and human services.
- The omnibus spending bill did not pass at the end of 2022 and is a likely starting point for 2023.

Rob Vanasek, Capitol Hill Associates, provided an overview of legislative issues for 2023. Given the margin of the chamber, it is a tenuous situation and priorities will not include many new issues. Hot issues include SCORE funding, product stewardship for mattresses, Metropolitan Landfill Contingency Action Trust (MLCAT), Closed Landfill Investment Fund (CLIF), Capital Assistance Program (CAP) for Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA), landfills, extended producer responsibility (EPR), waste-to-energy, compostable products, solar energy, and e-waste.

Commissioners Goettel and Reinhardt emphasized a need for notice of actions as issues arise, and the importance of ensuring first-year members understand that waste-to-energy is part of the hierarchy goals as an environmental solution.

Vanasek said the waste hierarchy will be challenged this year. The focus is on environmental justice and bills on air emissions to reach 100% by 2040. The Partnership is in a strong position to lead on EPR issues.

Commissioner Reinhardt said PWE should lean into the transition to eliminate refuse-derived fuel (RDF), emphasizing that the state needs to make an investment rather than making an unfunded law that eliminates RDF.

Reed reviewed the changes to the proposed 2023 platform, which maintains three primary messages of the last platform and refines it to sharpen the focus. Staff and lobbyists will begin sharing the platform with numerous partners, including MPCA, Minnesota Department of Commerce, Association of Minnesota Counties (AMC), Minnesota Inter-County Association (MICA), Minnesota Resource Recovery Association (MRRA), Recycling Association of Minnesota (RAM), Solid Waste Association of North America (SWANA) and League of Minnesota Cities.

Commissioner Reinhardt said PWE has long talked about being part of the solution and the circular economy. She suggested PWE call out climate resilience as the impact of the circular economy, making sure to use the legislature's nomenclature.

Commissioner Miron said there are a couple of areas in the platform that could easily incorporate "environmental justice" and "climate resilience". Commissioner Reinhardt stated she would prefer to pass the platform now and have final language incorporating those terms approved by the PWE Board chair.

Commissioner Reinhardt moved, seconded by Goettel, to approve Resolution PWE-2022-06, 2023 State Legislative Platform as written, with final language to be approved by the PWE Board chair.

#### **Wood Waste Study Report**

John Springman, Ramsey County Environmental Health, introduced a report on a study of wood waste approved by the PWE Board in the 2022 budget. Marisa Repka and Alicia Blake presented the report conducted by Cambium Carbon.

Commissioner Miron said he anticipates pushback in more rural areas on regulating open burning and that regulation should focus on large-volume burning at commercial locations. He also noted that no costs are identified, and no funding options presented for the stated goals. Unfunded mandates are problematic for cities, counties and businesses who are already controlling open burning.

#### **OTHER**

Commissioner Miron recognized the upcoming retirement of Jeff Travis, Washington County Public Health and Environment, and his 30 years of service with Washington County.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:**

#### **Legislative Session Update**

The Minnesota Legislative Session began on January 3, 2023. Staff and lobbyists will provide an update on activities and issues that may be addressed in the months ahead. The State Constitution requires the legislature to conclude business by May 22, 2023.

#### **Extended Producer Responsibility Update**

In 2021, the Partnership on Waste and Energy entered into a contract with the Product Stewardship Institute to coordinate and facilitate staff and stakeholder development of a legislative proposal to establish extended producer responsibility for packaging, customized to Minnesota's waste and recycling system. A progress update on this contract will be provided to the board, as well as key elements of a legislative proposal being developed through this process. In addition, staff will provide an update on activities related to extended producer responsibility for packaging, paper products and single-use products.

PWE supports tax and finance policies that create effective incentives and distribute resources in alignment with policy goals.


PWE supports robust state funding for local government to carry out statutory responsibilities.
