Tree removal and planting funding


The Partnership supports funding to the Department of Natural Resources and the Metropolitan Council for Community Tree Planting Grants to replace trees lost to forest pests, disease or storm damage and reinvigorate a climate-resilient shade tree canopy in our communities. The Partnership particularly appreciates the priority on removal and replacement of ash trees and the focus on resource-strapped communities, as emerald ash borer destroys community forests and urban canopy in a growing number of counties (50 and counting).

We encourage the committee to act favorably to address critical community forestry needs in our communities and create a legacy on our community landscape that will be appreciated by generations to come.

Capital Assistance Program (CAP) funding for solid waste infrastructure

The Partnership appreciates the recognition of solid waste challenges counties face and supports funding for solid waste management capital projects through Minnesota Pollution Control Agency CAP grants. Infrastructure development must keep pace with growing recycling and other waste management priorities. Local projects help meet statewide policy goals, and state investment is critical for their success. We call on the state to continue to build strong funding partnerships through other solid waste infrastructure opportunities, now and in future sessions.
