CALL TO ORDER

Chair Reinhardt called the meeting to order at 10 a.m. Introductions of attendees in Maplewood were made.

2024 Budget Status

Matt Phillips, R&E accounting manager, projected that the full amount of the budget will be spent in 2024.

UPDATES AND REPORTS

2023 PWE Annual Report

Leigh Behrens, R&E and Partnership staff, shared an overview of the Partnership 2023 Annual Report, which was released on April 17, 2024. Thanks were given to Partnership staff and leadership, Caleb Werth for project planning, Sam Ferguson for editing and design coordination and Metre for report graphic design.

Caleb Werth, R&E planning specialist, reviewed highlights of the annual report:

- Common goals include actions to address climate change such as legislative work, harnessing
 innovation in waste and energy sectors, developing next generation technologies and state and county
 climate planning.
- Product stewardship highlights included drafting the Packaging Waste and Cost Reduction Act
- bill language (HF 3911/SF3877) which was informed by 2022 committee process and feedback from interested parties, and which requires producers to financially support improvement and expansion of recycling programs.
- The Zero Waste Challenge was a month-long online challenge for residents, with the goal of having residents learn more about wasted food and making better use of food purchased. In 2023, nearly 600 participants across 75 teams completed over 4,800 actions.

Wood Waste Update

Caleb Johnson, Washington County and Partnership lead staff, cited that the budget included \$40k for funding wood waste reduction solutions. A Cambium Carbon agreement was signed and a first meeting upcoming. At the state level, John Klapperich was hired at the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) to work on wood waste. The group will meet in June and tour St. Paul Cogeneration, which received an air quality permit for burn boxes for biochar; the MPCA continues to work on permitting. Washington County is moving forward with a request for proposals (RFP) to work on moving wood waste higher up the hierarchy.

Legislative Update

Michael Reed, Ramsey County Environmental Health and Partnership lead staff, reviewed the Partnership's priorities going into the 2024 legislative sessions and results at session completion. For the 2025 session, the Partnership will need to take into account the possible shift of control in the House and Senate. Reed shared appreciation and recognition of Partnership staff and lobbyists whose work made the session successful.

Sam Richie, Fryberger Law, reviewed the primary goals for energy-related issues for the 2024 legislative session. Clean transportation legislation made headway, but without the ultimate goal of establishing the standards. Advocates objected to ethanol inclusion as a clean fuel. Opposition from both the liberal wing of the DFL and the GOP affects the ability to get these standards set and funded. The environmental bill provided some funding for tree planting to address emerald ash borer (EAB). There seems to be growing bipartisan support for addressing EAB with removal and planting. The Omnibus bill included \$5 million for Ramsey/Washington Recycling & Energy's (R&E) anaerobic digestor facility. The MPCA will work to reduce permitting times. The Public Utilities Commission will be taking up the issue of use of wood waste/biochar as carbon neutral energy.

Rob Vanasek, Capitol Hill Associates, reviewed the session as it relates to waste issues. 2024 exceeded 2023 in accomplishments. The packaging bill is the biggest win for the state of Minnesota and will bring massive amounts of money into the state with companies wanting to work on this. Minnesota is only the fifth state to pass packaging legislation. There was much support after the bill passed from lobby groups who had opposed the bill. It is anticipated that the bill will be challenged over the next few years, including attempts to have it repealed.

Vanasek shared that this was a groundbreaking, historic win; the biggest in 40 years. He recognized Mallory Anderson's work over the course of the session. He recognized all of the individuals, legislators, organizations and MPCA who were critical to and instrumental in getting this through. He recognized the

work of Dan Donkers, Ramsey County and Partnership staff, who stepped in during Anderson's leave of absence last year.

Other items which were passed included boat wrap product stewardship, a ban on mercury in lighting and a multi-family compost grant program. Many items were not successful; there were challenges to the waste hierarchy, changes to waste-to-energy, SCORE funding did not make it into the omnibus bill, the beverage bill was tabled and never heard in the Senate and many other items that did not make it through the session.

Mallory Anderson, Hennepin County and Partnership staff, reviewed the progression of the Packaging Waste and Cost Reduction Act through the House and Senate to reach Governor Walz's desk for signing on May 19, 2024. The goals of the legislation were achieved. Anderson reviewed the specifics of what was included in the bill and pointed out similarities and differences in legislation passed in Maine, Oregon, Colorado and California. She reviewed the impacts of these nation-leading reuse requirements. She also reviewed covered materials, covered entities, eco-modulated fees and reimbursements. By 2032, all packaging, food packaging and paper products must be able to be reused, recycled or composted through a curbside or alternative collection system.

PWE supports tax and finance policies that create effective incentives and distribute resources in alignment with policy goals.


PWE supports robust state funding for local government to carry out statutory responsibilities.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Section 5.2.4. of the Joint Powers Agreement for the Partnership on Waste and Energy (Partnership) provides direction on an annual budget.

- 5.2.4. The Governing Board shall develop and approve an annual budget (for the calendar year January 1 to December 31) at its first official meeting, and at a fall meeting in subsequent years.
- 5.2.4.1. The budget shall specify contributions by the Parties, which shall be allocated in equal parts to the Parties.
- 5.2.4.2. The Parties shall make their contributions to the Administrative Agent by February 28th of each year.

Staff have prepared a draft 2025 budget for board members to review and discuss. Staff will bring a revised budget back to the November 14, 2024, board meeting for final approval.
