



Building Material Reuse Grants

Many building materials - including cabinets, light fixtures, bricks, doors, plumbing fixtures, windows and much more - can be reused instead of being sent to a landfill.

Residential properties can get up to \$5,000, and commercial properties up to \$10,000, to support deconstruction projects. Deconstruction is the process of taking apart a building so that building materials can be reused. Additionally, up to \$5,000 is available to install salvaged materials into a project, and up to \$15,000 to support moving full structures.

Eligibility

- › Property owners or developers can apply.
- › Grants available to support projects including installation of salvaged materials, renovation or full structure removal.
- › Properties must be in Ramsey or Washington County.
- › Structures or area of renovation must be over 500 square feet and be built prior to 1970.

Program Requirements:

- › Minimum of five different material types must be recovered or installed.
- › Minimum of 1,000 pounds of wood material must be recovered from properties being deconstructed.
- › Non-reusable building materials generated from the project must be processed for recycling.
- › A site visit will be conducted to assess eligibility after application is received.
- › Grant applicants must verify reuse options and proper disposal for materials.
